The Ballmer Institute for Children's Behavioral Health is a transformational investment in youth, in families, and in the future—starting in Oregon.

Based on the University of Oregon Portland campus, the Ballmer Institute offers a first-of-its-kind undergraduate degree in Child Behavioral Health (CBH)—a bold, replicable workforce solution to one of society's most urgent challenges: the youth mental health crisis. Oregon ranks near the bottom of all states for youth mental health, with need among the highest in the country; today, half of families who seek help cannot find a provider.

The Child Behavioral Health Building directly addresses this shortage. As the future home of the Ballmer Institute and the Prevention Science Institute, it will expand training opportunities for CBH students, accelerate research that improves outcomes, and provide behavioral health services to children and families in Portland and across Oregon.

With state and donor support, this innovation hub will transform lives, strengthen communities, and establish Oregon as a national leader in children's behavioral health.

Behavioral Health Clinic

\$7.5M | A welcoming space that provides behavioral health services to youth and families through grant-funded research and offers supervised training opportunities for students. Individual clinic spaces include:

- \$250K | Family Intervention Rooms
- \$150K | Individual Intervention Rooms

Telehealth Center

\$5M | A training and remote service delivery facility where students will provide behavioral health care under the supervision of institute faculty to youth and families across the state. Individual telehealth spaces include:

- \$125K | Telehealth Offices

Instructional and Event Spaces

- \$2M | Auditorium: The premier event and gathering space in the building. A 4,000-square-foot room that adapts seamlessly for learning, collaboration, and public engagement.
- \$1M | Classroom: Modern state-of-the-art learning environment equipped to support both in-person and remote instruction.
